Being a member brings us all benifits, not only a great way to stay in touch with each other but theres plenty on the agenda.



REGIMENTAL HISTORY

HILL 112 - 8TH BATTALION THE RIFLE BRIGADE

A little known piece of ground except to those that fought there, Hill 112 to was a ridge of land west of the city of Caen. Regarded by both side as crucial,

"whoever holds Hill 112, holds Normandy"

SS-Obergruppenfűhrer Paul Hausser, Commander 7th Army


The assault on Hill 112 was part of Operation Epsom which would be the 3rd and final attempt to take the city of Caen on the 26th June 1944.

General Montgomery gave the 3rd attempt to capture the city of Caen to VIII Corps commanded by Lt General Sir Richard O'Conner a veteran of the desert campaigns in north Africa. He had 60,00 men, 600 tanks, 736 guns + XXX & I Corps guns, Navel gun fire from 3 x cruisers, RAF 2nd Tactical Air Force to provide close Air Support and prelim bombing raid on German positions by 250 RAF heavy bombers at his disposal which was later cancelled due to heavy rain.

O'Conners warfighting divisions were the 15 Scottish Division, 43 Wessex Division, 11 Armoured Division.

The commander of the 11th Armd Div was Maj general G.P.B 'Pip' Roberts, luckily for him he had both the 2nd Bn KRRC (Motor Rifle Bn) - 4th Armd Bde – Brigadier J.C. Currie

8th Bn RB (PCO) (Motor Rifle Bn) – 29th Armd Bde-Brigadier C.B.C Harvey under his command.



Previous attempts by the 51st Highland Division to outflank the city to the east and the 7th Armoured Divisions (Operation Perch) attempt to outflank west had both failed.

Operation Epson started by prelimanary supporting attacks to secure the flanks with XXX Corps to seize and hold high ground (right flank), I Corps left flank and to seize Caen if VIII Corps successful in the main attack against the German Line (Operation Epsom).

Success in this operation would force the Germans to abandon Caen and allow I Corps advance and seize the city.

Enemy forces, I SS Panzer Corps - commanded by SS-Obergruppenfűhrer (Lt-Gen) Josef 'Sepp' Dietrich which consisted of the 21st Panzer Division, 12th SS Panzer Division Hitlerjugend, and the Panzer Lehr Division. It was the young soldiers of the Hitlerjugend that stood directly in the path of VIII Corps, with elements of 21st Panzer Division to its east and Panzer Lehr Division to its west.

Units from III Flakkorps were emplaced behind the main defensive lines and as VIII Corps approached Dietrich had two companies of Tigers from the SS sPzAbt 101 moved up behind the Hitlerjugend.

The Operation opened up with a massive barrage from the artillery, then Motorized Infantry and Sherman tanks advanced across the open corn fields. The going was slow and only a 2 mile advance had been achieved in the first 48 hours.

The crossing over the Odon was secured on the evening of the 27th by the 2nd Bn The Argyle and Sutherland Highlanders. Next was crossing over the River Orne. In order to secure the crossing the high feature, Hill 112 would need to be taken first.

On the 29th at 05.30 am B Squadron, 23rd Hussars began the advance, halted by the German fierce defence, reinforcements from C Squadron, 23rd Hussars and the 8th Bn The Rifle Brigade moved up, they then pushed through and captured the Hill after heavy fighting that lasted all day. By the end of the day nearly all of the Sherman's some 40 of B & C Squadrons had been destroyed. The 8th Bn Rifle Brigade had also taken a heavy toll.

The Bn prepared defences and started to dig in, however the rest of the divisions advance had not been as far forward, leaving the front and both flanks exposed to German counter attacks. The 8th Bn position was tenuous being exposed on 3 sides along a long corridor.

The Germans counterattacked, launching the 9th, 10th and parts of the 2nd SS panzer divisions against to western flank of the corridor. Time and time again the Germans were driven back with a combination of the Sherman Tanks from the Hussars, Close Air support from RAF Typhoons as well as the entrenched Riflemen from the 8th Bn The Rifle Brigade.

The decision was made some time on the 30th after German Ultra intercepts revealed that reinforcements from II SS Panzer Corps were closeand tasked with the re caputure of Hill 112, the cost would be too high to for 11 Div to absorb. The decision was made by General Dempsy.


11 Division withdrew and consolidated around the Odon crossing bridgehead.

Operation Epsom ended with the bridgehead over the Oden but not the Orne.

This was the first of many actions by the 8th Rifle Brigade on the advance to Germany.
